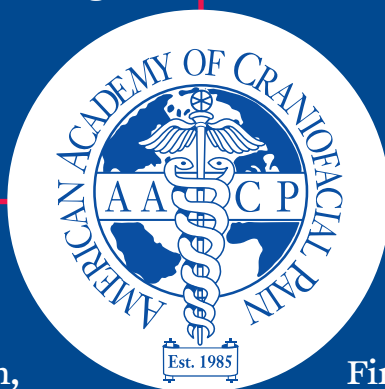

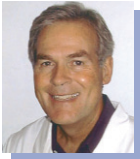

OBJECTIVES:

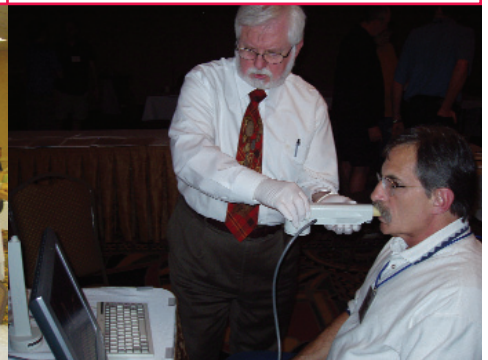
